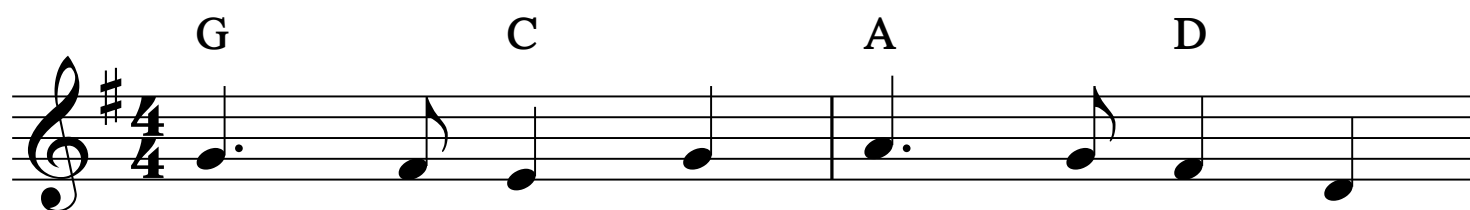
Chord symbols can be used by another musician, when accompanying on another instrument

Songs are scored in standard notation and laid out in a symmetrical, easy-to-follow approach

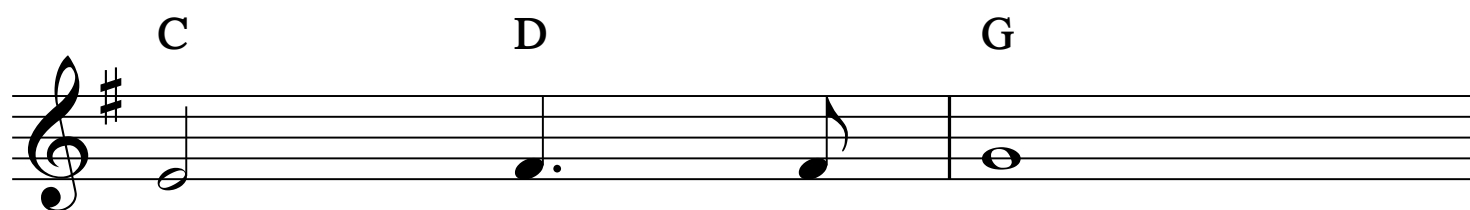
