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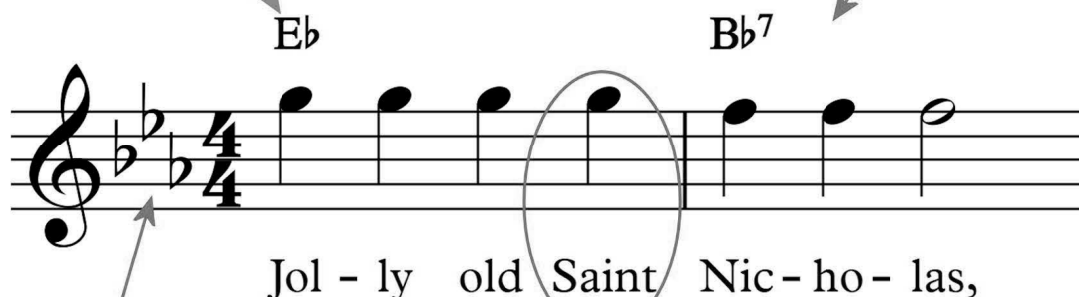


About this Songbook

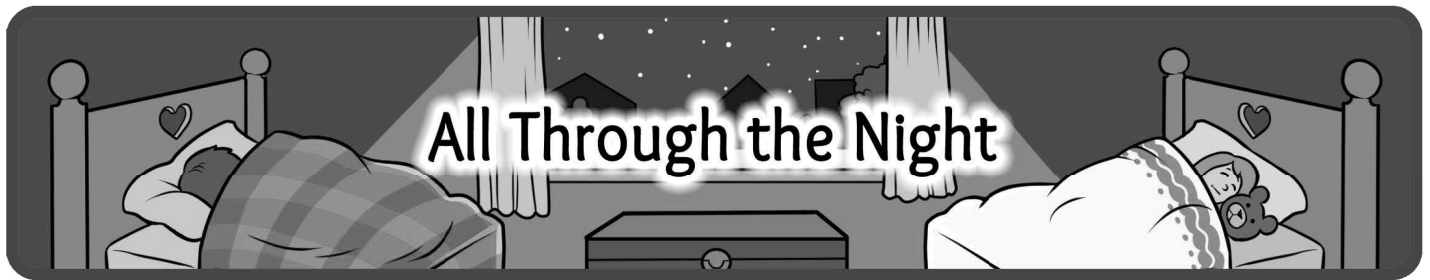
Chord symbols can be used by another musician, when accompanying on another instrument
