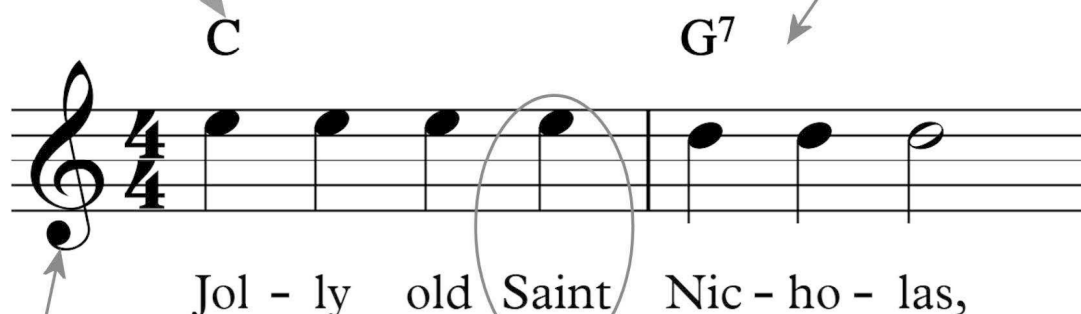


About this Songbook
